

**PUBLIC NOTICE
CITY OF MOBILE
CONSOLIDATED PLAN/ACTION PLAN
COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAM
CDBG-R AMENDMENT**

The city of Mobile intends to amend its 2008 Action Plan to make available additional funds for activities eligible under the Department of Housing and Urban Development's Community Development Fund (CDBG-R) and American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009.

The city is eligible to receive \$775,389 in CDBG-R funds for activities eligible for assistance under the normal CDBG entitlement grant funding. But HUD encourages cities to maximize job creation and give preference to activities that can be started and completed expeditiously.

Therefore the city is proposing to invest in one activity as follows:

Project Description: 1. Drainage improvements: Carver and Glass Avenues from Main Street to Owens Street and Third Avenue from Jessie Street to Owens Street.

2. Street resurfacing: Texas Pl. from Texas St. to North End, S. Dearborn St. from Elmira St. to North End, S. Warren St. from Savannah St. to North End, Cedar St. from Augusta St. to North End, S. Lawrence St. from Augusta St. to North End, S. Hamilton St. from Augusta St. to North End, S. Claiborne St. from Canal St. to Texas St., Martha Ct. from Bowman Ct. to Boykin Blvd, Pake Ave. from Martha Ct. to Jordan Dr., Pineda Ct. from Pake Ave. to Riff Rd., First St. from Van Liew Rd. E. to Boykin Blvd., Bowman Ct. from First St. to Martha Ct., Maureen Dr. from Clubhouse Rd. to North End, Seawell St. from Clubhouse Rd. to North End, Pineland Pl. from Clubhouse Rd. to North End, Short Van Liew Rd. from Clubhouse Rd. to Van Liew Rd. E., Melissa Ct. from Clubhouse Rd. to North End, Christine Cir. from Clubhouse Rd. to North End, Pine Rd. from Gill Rd. to Riverside Dr., and Cedar Down Dr. from Dauphin Island Pkwy. to West End.

These projects were selected because of the need in the community for modernization and improvements to basic services while maximizing job creation and economic benefit. They represent an investment in infrastructure that will provide long-term economic benefits and assists those most impacted by the recession. The work can be bid within 120 calendar days from the date the funds are made available to the city.

Citizen Comments: A public comment period on this activity will run from May 25 through June 1, 2009.
