

City Council Meeting Recap – May 2, 2023

MOBILE, AL – The Mobile City Council added a proposed annexation map to its agenda during the Tuesday, May 2, 2023 meeting. Map A, as it is referred to, is one of four submitted by the Mayor's Administration for Council consideration. If the Council approves the map during its next meeting, a referendum will be scheduled to allow residents to vote independently of each other. Map A is comprised of four independent voting blocks, categorized as Kings Branch, Orchard Estates, the Cottage Hill Corridor, and Airport Corridor. That means residents in any one or more of the four areas could vote in favor of the proposal, while others may not.

The Council approved a contract with Dell Consulting, LLC authorizing the use of Capital Improvement Plan funds for electrical and lighting improvements at Springhill, Harmon, and Hillsdale Community Centers, as well as a new design for the Stotts Park recreation center.

District 3 Council President C.J. Small announced a community cleanup in the Maysville Community, May 5th from 8 a.m. until 10:30 a.m. at Baumhauer-Randle Park. Everyone is invited to participate.

To celebrate Mobile's history, District 2 Councilman William Carroll presented a proclamation to representatives of the Historic Mobile Preservation Society, the Mobile Historic Development Commission, and the Downtown Mobile Alliance, proclaiming May 2023 as Historic Preservation Month in the City of Mobile.
