On May 14, I had the honor of presenting a proclamation recognizing May 2024 as **Historic Preservation Month** in the City of Mobile.

Mobile is fortunate to have its history reflected in the preservation efforts and restoration of a vast collection of historic homes and buildings that represent our heritage and define the character of our beautiful city. In the 2023 fiscal year alone, investments in locally designated historic districts exceeded \$189 million, and hundreds of historic buildings were given new life.
