Total allocation: \$2,201,643

Prevention Programs

1. **Into Light** – \$30,000
 - Art-based awareness program showcasing personal stories to reduce stigma.
2. **Goldfinch Health** – \$162,000
 - The "Billion Pill Pledge" aims to reduce post-surgery opioid prescriptions by 50%, preventing 45,000 unnecessary pills annually.
3. **Mobile United, Inc.** – \$150,000
 - Youth-led peer-to-peer drug prevention program for high school students.

Opioid Use Disorder (OUD) Treatment Programs

4. **Mobile Metro Treatment Center** – \$40,000
 - Transportation scholarships for OUD patients via UberHealth.
5. **Mobile Community Corrections Program** – \$313,736
 - Expands the Adult Drug Court Program, adding 200 participants with more counseling, inpatient treatment, housing, and drug testing.
6. **Door to Serenity** – \$50,000
 - Dental scholarships for residents recovering from OUD.

Coordination & Communication

7. **Yosemite, CiviConnections, Wellborn Strategies** – \$250,000
 - Mass media and awareness campaign focusing on reducing stigma and educating the public about OUD and treatment/other resources in Mobile.

Programs Addressing Multiple Needs

8. **Home of Grace for Women** – \$135,282
 - Expands a long-term recovery program, increasing treatment capacity by 20%.
9. **Family Counseling Center, Inc.** – \$50,000
 - Expands SAFE Care for pregnant/postpartum mothers with OUD, providing early intervention.
10. **Mobile County Veterans Treatment Court** – \$139,000
 - Expands services for veterans, adding staffing and drug testing resources.
11. **USA/C&W Hospital** – \$175,000
 - Community-based support for mothers with OUD, using prenatal/postnatal interventions.
12. **Franklin Primary Health Center, Inc.** – \$204,915

- Expands opioid treatment services, including naloxone distribution, overdose prevention, and peer recovery coaching.

13. Waterfront Rescue Mission – \$124,660

- Brings a holistic recovery program to Mobile, providing counseling and wellness services.

14. Mobile Area Interfaith Conference – \$127,050

- Supports reentry services for formerly incarcerated individuals to reduce opioid misuse.

15. Boys & Girls Clubs of South Alabama – \$50,000

- Expands drug education within its youth mentorship program.

16. The Lovelady Center – \$200,000

- Provides 40 scholarships for women in long-term recovery, including room, board, and healthcare.
